



Are you a Survivor of an Abusive Relationship?

Are you interested in telling your story?

Help inform future research and mental health professionals on the process of overcoming abusive relationships (including physical, sexual, and/or emotional/psychological abuse) by participating in a new research study aimed at understanding the process of overcoming a past abusive relationship. We are seeking participants who (a) are at least 21 years of age, (b) were formerly abused by an intimate relationship partner (e.g., a boyfriend, life partner, spouse), (c) have been out of any abusive relationship for at least two years, and (d) speak English.

Participants will be asked to complete an on-line survey, which is estimated to take about 20 minutes to complete. All participants who complete the survey will have the option to enter a drawing for one of two \$50 store gift cards.
